Have you ever wondered if what the angels said, and what Jesus taught, was a fantasy?

Peace seems very distant. But, in fact, the peace God promised is a reality. And there is more to that peace than the shepherds realised, but it is made clear to us.

You can have peace with God

The baby born in Bethlehem was born to be crucified at a place called Calvary.

He is the Saviour. When He died He was dealing with our wrong. Sin is within us. It is the breaking of God's commands. It is offensive to Him. It cuts us off from God and would do so forever. But out of love for us, Jesus suffered, carrying our sin in our place. The hell we should suffer *after* death, Jesus suffered *before* death, not in the next world but in this.
